Christmas offering

This year we are supporting the work of Tearfund's Rohingya Refugee Emergency Crisis Fund.

More than 911,000 people fled violence in Myanmar and are now living in refugee camps in Bangladesh (UNICEF, April 2019), surviving in extremely basic conditions. Of these, an estimated 7,700 are orphans.

Life is made more bearable for children living in refugee camps by providing child-friendly, safe spaces to recover from the trauma they have endured and to just be children. They also provide teenage girls with female dignity kits containing detergent, sanitary pads, multiple pairs of underwear and a torch; train families in safe hygiene practices; and provide water storage containers and buckets for hand washing.
